personally came before me, the undersigned Inspector and Superintendent of Police of and for
Perce, in the District of Gaspé, and severally acknowledge themselves to owe to Our Lady the
Queen, the several sums following, that is to say, the said Michel Page Senior,
Michel Page Junior and Antoine Page
the sum of three hundred dollars currency, and the said
Fredrick McJennis and Alexis Boulet
the sum of one hundred dollars currency, each
of good and lawful current money of this Province, to be made and levied of their several goods
and Chattels, Lands and Tenements, respectively, to the use of Our said Lady the Queen, her Heirs
and Successors, if the said Michel Page Senior, Michel
Page Junior and Antoine Page
fail in the condition herein under written.

The condition of the above recognizance is such, that whereas the said Michel
Page Senior, Michel Page Junior and Antoine Page
were charged before me the said Justice
day of July instant - and at the fifth previous
Month - at Bonaventure Island, in
the county and District of Gaspé
feloniously did steal, take and carry
away a certain quantity of rope, iron
and a part of the standing rigging
of the main-mast of the wrecked ship
Permonds - amounting in all to
about three quintals and valued at
about twelve or thirteen dollars the
said articles being of the goods and
chattels of George J. Brochu

If therefore the said Michel Page Senior, Michel
Page Junior and Antoine Page
will appear at the next Court of Queen's Bench
to be holden in and for the District of Gaspé, and there surrender
themselves into the custody of the Keeper of the Common Gaol there, and plead to such
indictment as may be found against them by the Grand Jury, for and in respect to the charge
aforesaid, and take their trial upon the same, and not depart the said Court without leave, then
the said Recognizance to be void, or else to stand in full force and virtue.
